

### Homework:

## Attendance


Our class targets for attendance this year is **96.5%**.

Children

Reading books are changed when a book has been read, the diary signed **by an adult** and reading task (if one is given) is completed. We expect to see bookbags on a Friday, or when complete.



Parents

Read with your child each night and ask relevant questions about the book to ensure they're understanding the text. This will also improve their comprehension skills. If they need help with homework, please make a note next to the questions you have assisted them with.





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As mentioned, attendance is a big focus and we ask that children and parents work together to ensure they arrive on time (8:40am-8:55am) and attend everyday. We understand that people get sick and appreciate that this means sometimes the children may be too unwell to attend school, but please do let us know if this is the case.

## R.S.H.E a gowrney in Love



A Journey in Love is a resource created by Sister Jude Groden of BRES. It is the recommended programme of study for Catholic schools for Sex and Relationship Education, and has been written as a progressive scheme of work that supports the Religious Education, PSHE and Science curricula taught within the school.



Throughout A Journey in Love, an aspect of the mystery of love is focussed upon in each group, children and young people are encouraged to marvel at the wonder and beauty of God's creative love. This is reflected in each stage of a person's growth in the Primary Years through a series of suggested, progressive and developmental tasks, activities and reflections which focus on physical, social, emotional, intellectual and spiritual development.

As with all aspects of learning, children are naturally curious and many will have questions related to their lessons. Opportunities to discuss questions form part of the lessons and again these are treated with care and understanding.



A Journey in Love highlights the importance of parental input and children will be told to discuss their lessons at home. As a parent, you have the right to withdraw your child from Sex Education at anytime if you wish to do so.
