Rationale





With so much competition for children's time and attention it is vital that we embed a culture of reading into the core of what we do as a school, helping every child to become a lifelong reader. At St Laurence's Catholic School we ensure reading is a **top priority** within all areas of the curriculum. We ensure **purposeful books and vocabulary focuses** are at the heart of everything we teach to ensure extensive reading and exposure to a wide range of texts make a vital contribution to every child's educational achievement, regardless of their personal background.


Literacy Lesson Focus



A story of a mischievous boy and an old horrible granny. Children can relate to the boy and write instructions for their own medicine.




Cross Curricular Texts




Book Focus (Year 3 - Spring 2):




A beautiful story with great illustrations. Is magic real? Leon disappears in a magic box and meets all the items that disappear. A great book for prediction writing and using your imagination




