


This book looks at the different ocean animals that inhabit our world.

I Want my Hat Back follows the adventures of animals in a forest environment.


We have chosen these books as we know that are children really enjoy learning about animals.


## Book Focus (Year 2 - Autumn 2):

#### Literacy Lesson Focus




This book challenges the idea that our outward appearance reflects who we are. We have chosen this book as it appeals to both gender and allows them to create interesting pieces.


#### Class Read / Poetry

### Literacy Lesson Focus




This is a traditional tale with a twist. Why wait for a Prince to save you when you can save yourself? This is book has been chosen as it appeals to both genders.







